

#### CMA Weekly Update - July 30, 2021

The only way we defeat COVID-19 and sustain our economic recovery is to support all efforts to get more Americans vaccinated. The rising case numbers demonstrate the urgency of our vaccination goal, and they also mean that other mitigation measures may be needed until we achieve it—such as what we heard this week from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

In light of CDC's new <u>guidance</u>, and the subsequent operating decisions association leaders are now faced with, the CMA issued a flash survey to get feedback on your associations' operations and protocols. ## **Key Issues**

**Historic Infrastructure Proposal Within Reach** This week the Senate <u>voted</u> to advance an historic and bipartisan \$1.2 trillion infrastructure bill in a 67-32 vote. See NAM President and CEO Jay Timmons's statement on this week's developments <u>here</u>.

As the package goes through an amendment process that seeks to maintain bipartisan support for the legislation, manufacturing associations need to keep up the momentum as we work with leaders in both parties to get a final bill passed. Here's what we have on tap:

- SAVE THE DATE: On <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>August 4</u>, we're asking our association partners to
  mobilize on social media to show coordinated support for action on the bipartisan

- **Get Active:** Use the <u>Building to Win Toolkit</u> to mobilize your members with sample messages, draft letters to the editor and contact Congress tools.
- **Make Use:** Thanks to those of you who joined the <u>manufacturing infrastructure sign-on</u> <u>letter</u>, which was shared with the White House and every office in Congress. It's a terrific tool for you to use in your own organization's advocacy going forward.

**But wait, there's more!** Don't miss this research published this week by our friends at the Association of Equipment Manufacturers (AEM) showing the infrastructure deal will create nearly 100,000 new jobs for their industry (direct, indirect and induced effects).

Manufacturers Support All Efforts to Get Americans Vaccinated Yesterday, President Biden announced that federal employees must be vaccinated or face strict protocols including increased testing and restricted travel. The administration will also expand paid leave for employees who take off to get vaccinated and offer \$100 to Americans getting vaccinated. On our own team, the NAM achieved a voluntary vaccination rate of 98%, and to ensure our team mates and those with whom we interact are as safe as possible, we have made the decision to require vaccinations by mid-September.
